

# **HILLSBOROUGH FIRE DISTRICT#1**

## **REIMBURSEMENT FEE SCHEDULE**

This fee schedule outlines the reimbursement of costs for stand-by fire protection services due to product release, required emergency stand-by, fire suppression costs as outlined in N.J.A.C. 5:70-2.13 and other emergencies.

In the event of a spill, stand-by or other emergency incident the responsible party **may** receive abatement for services from the Hillsborough Fire District for the first initial hour at no cost, but shall be subject to reimbursement fees for every hour thereafter.

### **RESOURCE FEES:**

Fire engine \$90.00 per hour  
Ladder \$125.00 per hour  
Tanker operation \$45.00 per hour  
Incident command vehicle \$25.00 per hour  
All other apparatus \$90.00 per hour  
Volunteer personnel \$20.00 per hour  
Career personnel-per hour pay rate at the time of the incident

All incident supplies shall be reimbursed at current replacement costs.

Decontamination / replacement of equipment shall be reimbursed at current decontamination or replacement costs.

### **Hazardous Material Releases:**

The Hillsborough Fire District shall recognize the following products referenced in the DOT Emergency Response Guidebook as hazardous products:

- Class 1 - Explosives
  - Division 1.1 Explosives with a mass explosion hazard
  - Division 1.2 Explosives with a projection hazard
  - Division 1.3 Explosives with predominantly a fire hazard
  - Division 1.4 Explosives with no significant blast hazard
  - Division 1.5 Very insensitive explosives; blasting agents
  - Division 1.6 Extremely insensitive detonating articles
- Class 2- Gases
  - Division 2.1 Flammable gases

Division 2.2 Non-flammable, non-toxic\* compressed gases  
Division 2.3 Gases toxic\* by inhalation
